

Please go through the below information with an adult. It is for all children playing tennis at the club within a DRH Sports coaching programme, lesson, or camp.

As a young person taking part in tennis at the Tennis Club, we understand you have the right to;

- ✓ Enjoy the time you spend with us and know that you are safe.
- ✓ Be looked after if there's an accident or injury, and have your parents informed.
- ✓ Be told who you can talk to if something's not right and you will be listened to.
- ✓ Where appropriate, make contributions, be included and involved towards decisions about the tennis you're involved with at the club.
- ✓ Be respected by coaches and members of staff and to be treated fairly.
- ✓ Feel welcomed, valued, and not judged.
- ✓ Be encouraged and supported in developing skills.

As a young person taking part in a tennis activity at The Tennis Club we'd like you to follow this guidance to make sure you are able to take part safely;

- ✓ Keep yourself and your peers safe by listening to your coach and behaving sensibly.
- ✓ Take care of our equipment and premises.
- ✓ Make it to sessions on time.
- ✓ Bring the right kit to sessions and appropriate for that day's weather.
- ✓ Do not leave the tennis club without your parent or another designated person who your parent has told you will be collecting you.
 - If DRH Sports have received written consent prior to the start session and have confirmed receipt, those aged over 10 years may leave the site without a parent or guardian.
- ✓ Do not discriminate or use bullying language or behaviour towards any other players or spectators.
- ✓ Tell your coach or another member of staff if you see or are aware of any bullying or discrimination.
- ✓ Treat other young people with respect and be aware that everyone has different levels of skill and talent.
- ✓ Encourage your teammates and be supportive when they are struggling.
- ✓ Respect our staff (and staff of other players in matches).



We expect all young people to follow the behaviours and requests set out in this code. If any young person behaves in a way which contradicts any of the points set out above, we'll address the problem straight away with the parent's involvement to resolve the issue.

Continued issues and repeated breaches of this code may result in us regrettably asking you to leave the activity, event, or club permanently, for the welfare of other young people and our staff. This is something we never want to do.
